Dr. Magill was appointed the Vernon F. Gallagher Chair for the Integration of Science, Theology, Philosophy, and Law at Duquesne University in 2007, where he is a tenured professor in the Center for Healthcare Ethics. In 1987, he earned a Ph.D. in Theology from Edinburgh University in Scotland. He developed his scholarly career at Saint Louis University, and in 1996 he was appointed the department chair of the Center for Healthcare Ethics. As executive director of the Center, he held multiple appointments, including serving as division director in the Department of Internal Medicine at the University Hospital, a member of the University's Institutional Review Board, a member of the Hospital Ethics Committee, a professor in the School of Medicine and a professor in the School of Public Health. He has published numerous books and articles in the field of bioethics including a co-authored textbook titled *Contemporary Catholic Health Care Ethics*.

The James F. Drane Lecture Series is an annual event in which prominent scholars and leaders in the field of bioethics lecture at Edinboro University from various important topics in bioethics. These lectures, in addition to providing ethical insight, knowledge, and leadership, honor the legacy of Professor James F. Drane as one of the founders of the discipline of bioethics.
